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THE HISTORY

of the College




The joining of these two distinctive schools represented an exciting vision for faith based education on the Isle of Wight by creating the first and only 11-18 Christian High School for the Island. Christ the King College is based on very clear aims and foundational principles; we aspire to live, learn and work together in the way exemplified to us by the life of Jesus Christ. The name of the College, Christ the King, and its motto, Via Veritas Vita (The Way, The Truth, The Life) reflect our founding principles which underpin our work.

Since its formation, the College has gone from strength to strength and is now a very successful school. As the only provider of faith based secondary education on the Isle of Wight, the College draws its students from across the Island. The expansion of the age range to full secondary provision has necessitated a growth in numbers, but the College has retained its distinctive family ethos and exceptional levels of pastoral care.

Christ the King College was founded in September 2008, following the amalgamation of two highly successful schools, one Church of England and one Roman Catholic.

In particular, the College offers;

We put a great emphasis on the development of the individual, celebrating each child's uniqueness in the eyes of God and fostering in them feelings of self-worth and selfbelief. We love to celebrate success in whatever form, sharing in the achievement of others and supporting those who face difficulties.

As our College has grown our ethos has remained firmly rooted in family, friendliness and the personal touch, as we believe that the success of our College depends upon close cooperation between students, parents, governors and staff.



We are very proud of Christ the King College and all that it represents. The College offers all students the opportunity to succeed at the highest standards whilst also recognising that each student is an individual.





Standards are expected to be high in all aspects of College life. Success is not evaluated on examination success alone but, where relevant, examination success will fulfil expectations and frequently exceed them. The learning environment is calm and well managed, with good behaviour and discipline, enabling all students to engage in their learning without disruption.

Uniform is expected to be worn with pride, reflecting the high standards and expectations of the College but appropriate to the age, maturity and gender of our students.

The extensive range of extra-curricular provision provides enhancement, enrichment and extension of the learning in College. Equality of opportunity is a core principle underpinning our provision of excellence, and the identification of under-achievement, lack of aspiration or disengagement is a key role of leadership and management, ensuring that each individual has the opportunity to excel.

Levels of care and support are exceptional. As a Christian College, our ethos is firmly rooted in our Christian faith and the structures and organisation of the College reflect the core principle of care and support. The College operates a structure of Form Tutors, Pastoral Support Assistants and Learning Support Team, that enable pastoral or academic concerns to be identified at an early stage for intervention and support.

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CURRIGULUM A Christ the King Culon

Christ the King College offers a broad, balanced and individualised curriculum, and throughout Lockdown OFSTED found that leaders and those responsible for governance are taking effective action to provide education in current circumstances.

This success of our students is based on our outstanding teaching, by talented and committed specialist teachers, careful monitoring and feedback, very strong parental support and excellent relationships between staff and students. Fundamental to our curriculum is the belief that children achieve better when they enjoy their learning. Our personalised 'stage not age' approach to learning means our most able students are enabled to flourish and extend their learning and those young people requiring more time to consolidate their learning are able to do so. Evidence of the success of this approach is found in the outcomes and progress our students make, validated by both our internal tracking and our progress and value-added figures.



CURRICULUM

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At Key Stage 3, a clear and relentless focus on Literacy, and Numeracy underpins the curriculum, ensuring that students are equipped with those basic skills that are essential for access to all subjects in their later years in College and are crucial to working life and being successful adults.

Students also learn to take more responsibility for their own learning, developing the skills of independent study and active learning that facilitate success at Key Stage 4 and 5. To develop self-motivated learners, who enjoy learning and engage in the process is a responsibility of the College and bedding in a love of learning at Key Stage 3 will bring success at the higher levels and the development of lifelong learners.

KEY STAGE 4 CURRICULUM

The Key Stage 4 curriculum builds on the achievements, learning skills and experiences of Key Stage 3.

CORE SUBJECTS

All students will study:

Our curriculum enables students to follow an individual pathway, offering opportunities for our students to follow a range of subjects that suit their abilities, interests and aspirations. Academic, vocational and work related learning pathways, or a mixture of each, are offered.

The targeted support for individual students begins pro-actively at the start of their journey through Key Stage 4 and not as an intervention measure at the later stages. Indeed, the engagement of parents as partners is integral to the successes of our students. Our Year 9 option system enables the majority of students to be able to study their first three choices in Key Stage 4 as we work to create a timetable that is centred and built upon the individual course choices of each student in the College.

Enrichment and extension programmes are an essential part of the curriculum. It is regarded as vital that each individual student has the opportunity to learn, in the widest sense of the word, outside of the classroom. Day excursions, residential visits, off-site learning, work related learning, study weekends and retreats all have their place in developing the wholeness of the individual students. These are planned to broaden the students' experiences and contribute to their all-round development.

Subjects currently on offer at Key Stage 4 include:



We believe in living and working together in a way that enables all of us to be happy, safe and to achieve the highest possible standards in our work. Teachers recognise achievements by awarding Reward Points, certificates for work, positive contribution or effort within our community. The Reward Points accumulate and generate further Achievement Certificates that are shared with our students in assemblies, as well as rewards such as celebration breakfasts, lunches or film afternoons.



The predicted outcomes for our students are always aspirational to ensure that our young people can compete with the best nationally for university places and employment routes.

To achieve and sustain these high standards, Christ the King College has developed robust monitoring systems which enable students to be regular assessed and their progress tracked. This enables the appropriate level of challenge, support and intervention to be given to each individual so that they can achieve their own personal target for whichever stage they are at in our College.

Parents are provided with regular information about their children's progress through our frequent and detailed reporting system, and our regular Parent Consultation Evenings.

We are proud that our success extends to those students with special and additional educational needs whose relative progress is also of an exceptionally high standard. Students with additional educational needs are well supported in their lessons with particular attention to their programmes of study and group sizes. Those with particular skills, gifts and talents are also

encouraged and challenged with a wide range of resources, visits and other enrichment activities.

There is also a clear expectation on the homework requirements for our students which is set in order to consolidate learning, develop independent work and prepare students to take responsibility for their own work. This is increasingly important as students move through the College and undertake external examinations.

PASTORAL CARE

Guidance & Support



A strong feature of our work is the exceptional level of care provided for our students and is expected of each other.

In addition to having a Form Tutor, each individual student is supported by a Head of Year and a non-teaching Pastoral Support Assistant. With rare exceptions, Form Tutors and Year Heads move through the College with their cohort of students, enabling our students to receive continuity of care and for strong relationships to be built. The Form Tutor is usually the first point of contact for parents and carers.



Our Behaviour for Learning Policy establishes the clear and high standards and expectations for all. In particular, the College offers an experience of Christian community living, promoting respect for self and others, an awareness of moral values and preparation for life in our society. In those exceptional circumstances where students fail to maintain the standards of behaviour expected, the Behaviour for Learning Policy is implemented. This is a staged system designed to support students pastorally as individuals, help to modify any inappropriate behaviour and encourage everyone to make the right choices in their journey through Christ the King College.





THE SPIRITUAL LIFE of the College

As a faith-based community, the spiritual life of our students is developed, nourished and supported in a variety of ways.





Our common faith is expressed through our Collective Acts of Worship, through our daily prayer life and through our commitment to developing young people who are witnesses to Christ's love.

All our curriculum areas contribute to the development of students' spiritual growth and the role of Religious Education as a core subject ensures that all students receive high quality teaching and learning which explores spiritual and moral issues, develops their understanding of the teachings of Christ and the Church, enables their individual faith journey to be developed and prepares them for the challenges of adulthood.

As you would expect, worship is of particular importance to us. We recognise that our students and staff come from a wide range of backgrounds and can

be at different places on their spiritual journeys. We are inclusive in our worship, basing the experiences for students on a shared belief in the love of God and the truth of the Gospel message, whilst recognising the richness of diversity and the differences between traditions.

During the academic year, students participate in Masses, Celebrations of Holy Communion and the ecumenical services based around the liturgical calendar and in response to specific themes. Their contribution through choir, music, dance, serving, reading or in any other appropriate way is actively encouraged and Celebration Worships, held at the end of each half term, provide the whole College the opportunity to join in celebrating the unique and God given talents of our individual students.
